



## **Medical Amnesty Protocol for Formal Recruitment Activities**

*Whereas*, the Interfraternity Council considers safety its highest priority,

*Whereas* the Interfraternity Council recognizes the necessity for the Greek community to shift towards a dry recruitment and intake system for all of its prospective new members,

*Whereas* the Interfraternity Council aligns its strategic vision with a harm reduction model,

*Whereas* the growth and success of the Greek community depends on curbing high-risk behavior during the recruitment and intake process,

*Whereas* transparency and clarity are critical to the Interfraternity Council's policies and their respective implementation processes,

*Be it therefore resolved* that the standing Medical Amnesty Protocol (MAP) be condensed to the following policy for the formal recruitment period:

Medical Amnesty Protocol that will allow chapters the ability to remove the need for a carefully considered choice to call for medical assistance on a chapter's behalf.

- *At any time* a chapter invokes MAP during the formal recruitment period, it will receive no Greek Judicial Board sanction
- Instead, pertinent chapter officers will be referred to an informal educational discussion with the IFC Vice President for Judicial Affairs and any other necessary parties for a non-sanction oriented consultation
- MAP is applicable at *any location*, on-campus or off-campus
- Any MAP invocations during the formal recruitment period *will not be counted towards the number of instances a chapter uses MAP during the regular semester*, as applicable to the standing Medical Amnesty Protocol Resolution passed on 3/9/2011
- As a means of member education, all chapters will be asked to disseminate this protocol information to all of its members assisting in the formal recruitment process
